FISCAL AND ECONOMIC IMPACT STATEMENT FOR ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

RULE TITLE: Registration of Foods, Drugs, and Prophylactic Devices; Consumable Hemp; and UV Tanning Facilities and Equipment

I. ESTIMATED IMPLEMENTATION COSTS (SAVINGS) TO STATE OR LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS (Summary)

Implementation of the proposed rule is not anticipated to have a programmatic fiscal impact on the state other than the cost of promulgation in FY 27. It is anticipated that \$1,207 SGF will be expended in FY 27 for the administrative costs associated with promulgation of the proposed and final rules.

The proposed rule repeals obsolete provisions in Title 49 (Public Health) of the Louisiana Administrative Code (LAC), including provisions previously transferred to Title 51, and amends the LAC to align those provisions with current practices

and statutory requirements. Specifically, the proposed rule removes references to the registration of cosmetics to comply with the provisions of Act 573 of the 2026 R.S., eliminates obsolete provisions related to state enrichment standards for bread and flour products to comply with the provisions of Act 875 of the 2026 R.S., and repeals additional obsolete regulations in accordance with Executive Order JML 25-38 to ensure the LAC contains only regulations that are necessary, lawful, and balanced in their language and application.

II. ESTIMATED EFFECT ON REVENUE COLLECTIONS OF STATE OR LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL UNITS (Summary)

It is anticipated that implementation of the proposed rule will have no impact on state or local revenue collections.
